But we know what God can do at Emmaus!! :) Next, I keep applications in my car and fill them out with the pilgrim, I often take it to their pastor to sign for them, and “bug them” until you get it back. We really need people to share the gift that was given to them. Remember what was said at the end of your Walk when you received your cross? **“I'm counting on Christ!”** and **“Christ is counting on you!”** Please ask a friend today!

## Living a Life of Piety

On my Walk to Emmaus, I had the privilege of hearing Linda Forbes speak about Piety. She stressed that piety is NOT momentary pious acts, outward religiosity, or religious routines. Linda Forbes said that piety IS a life surrendered to God. Even Jesus, in John 7:16, declared that his words were not his own, but directed by the One who sent him. Jesus gives the supreme example of piety by the way he lived his life, in complete surrender to God.

In order to live a life of piety, it is necessary to seek God. “What Would Jesus Do?” is a good way to start, but more important is time invested in reading the Bible and in prayer. It is through Bible reading and prayer that we can best understand God and what He calls us to do. Linda Forbes pointed out in her talk that “searching the Scripture is the source for learning the mind, heart, and soul of God,” and that prayer is the “communication language of the soul.”

Living a life of piety is easier when we surround ourselves with people who are also seeking to live that way. In her talk, Linda Forbes pointed out that worship is the foundation of all Christian life and community. Holy Communion reminds us of the love God shows us through Jesus Christ. When we have friends who share our beliefs, we can strengthen each other along life’s way.

Living a life of piety can’t stem from a desire to draw attention to oneself. As our Bible study and prayer time helps us better understand the mind, heart, and soul of God, our desire will naturally become to deflect attention from ourselves and point that attention toward the God we love and serve.

## Our Obedience as Christ Followers

Laws are established to maintain peace and well being for all citizens. In spite of these statutes, there are those who choose to disobey the laws of the land, and appropriate consequences are in place. *The Book of Jonah* is an example of the consequences suffered in disobeying God's law.

Jonah lived in Gath Hopher, a few miles north of Nazareth, just west of the Sea of Galilee, near the Tigris River. Nineveh was a three day journey to the east, and was the capital of the Assyrian Empire (Syria) - a bitter enemy of Israel. God told Jonah, "go to Nineveh, that great city, and cry against it; for their wickedness is come up before me" (Jonah 1:1).

Jonah fled to Joppa (Tel Aviv) where he found a ship going in the opposite direction. When a great storm arose, he was tossed overboard, swallowed by a great fish, and stayed in its belly for three days. *The Harmony of Science and Scripture* tells of an English sailor who fell overboard and was swallowed by a fish. Days later, the fish was taken ashore and was opened up. The man was alive, but his skin

had turned chalky white and remained so for the rest of his life.

Jonah is a picture of God's faithfulness. While he could have died from drowning in rough seas, God sent a great fish to rescue him. Jonah had three days in unimaginable despair. During those three days, Jonah repented and begged for mercy. God was intent upon sending Jonah with His message, and He went to great lengths to "encourage" the prophet to go. When the message was delivered to the Ninevites, they immediately repented, and God spared them. (Jonah 3:10)

We too are expected to share God's Word with the lost - even if they are our enemy. Our choice not to share the Gospel is a reflection of Jonah's disobedience, as it separates us from God's command in The Great Commission.

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## Growth through Bible Study—It Happened To Me

Throughout my early 20s I avoided Bible studies at my church. I began learning how to be the person God called me to be, because the Holy Spirit was able to reveal God's truth to me in study. I began spending time with fellow believers who were also studying the same Scriptures and we encouraged one another. I was becoming a better disciple and the more I knew the more I wanted to know and share. God's Word became real, personal, and alive in my life and it was (and still is) exciting and awesome. It's my sincere hope that studying your Bible becomes just as important, personal, and meaningful to you.
