Last Christmas was a beautiful and humbling experience for my husband Keith and me. We were in the hospital in Gainesville, Florida following his kidney and pancreas transplants. Christmas evening a nurse made the rounds with her guitar. She stopped in each room and sang two songs for each patient and their visitors. Her voice was beautiful. The part that made her gift so special was the fact that the other nurses on the floor didn't know she played guitar!

God has given each of us gifts that he expects us to share. Do you know what yours is? Mine is the gift of encouragement. So many people have encouraged me over the years that it spills out of me and onto those God places in my path. I cannot adequately describe the warm feeling of hearing someone provide me with just the word of encouragement I needed, when I needed it. As difficult as that is to describe, it is even harder for me to describe those rare occasions that I have been able to gently say what another needed to hear, and see their heart warm as they received the encouragement I offered, and to know that the words of encouragement were provided to me by God.

Proverbs 25:11 states, "A word fitly spoken is like apples of gold in a setting of silver." Psalm 141:3 is a verse I keep on my desk at work. It says, "Set a guard, O Lord, over my mouth and keep watch over the door of my lips!" My mother-in-law keeps that same verse on her bathroom mirror, and it brings me joy to know that our hearts and minds are connected by that verse and our mutual love for the God who inspired it.

Of all the gifts you can give this Christmas, keep in mind that the gift of "a word fitly spoken" can provide greater and longer-lasting pleasure than anything you can pick up off a store shelf. And the gift of your time is of greater worth than any costly bauble. This Christmas season, set about being the hands and feet of Christ to those around you. Begin with those you see every day, and extend the exercise to the cashier, the waiter or waitress, the person at the next pump at the gas station, the mail carrier, the delivery driver, and anyone else who comes to mind. You'll be amazed to see the change in yourself as you deliberately spread the love of Christ!

## Luke 2:1-20 Contemporary English Version (CEV)

### The Birth of Jesus

<sup>1</sup> About that time Emperor Augustus gave orders for the names of all the people to be listed in record books. <sup>2</sup> These first records were made when Quirinius was governor of Syria.

<sup>3</sup> Everyone had to go to their own hometown to be listed. <sup>4</sup> So Joseph had to leave Nazareth in Galilee and go to Bethlehem in Judea. Long ago Bethlehem had been King David's hometown, and Joseph went there because he was from David's family.

<sup>5</sup> Mary was engaged to Joseph and traveled with him to Bethlehem. She was soon going to have a baby, <sup>6</sup> and while they were there, <sup>7</sup> she gave birth to her first-born son. She dressed him in baby clothes and laid him on a bed of hay, because there was no room for them in the inn.

### The Shepherds

<sup>8</sup> That night in the fields near Bethlehem some shepherds were guarding their sheep. <sup>9</sup> All at once an angel came down to them from the Lord, and the brightness of the Lord's glory flashed around them. The shepherds were frightened. <sup>10</sup> But the angel said, "Don't be afraid! I have good news for you, which will make everyone happy. <sup>11</sup> This very day in King David's hometown a Savior was born for you. He is Christ the Lord. <sup>12</sup> You will know who he is, because you will find him dressed in baby clothes and lying on a bed of hay."

<sup>13</sup> Suddenly many other angels came down from heaven and joined in praising God. They said:

<sup>14</sup> "Praise God in heaven!  
Peace on earth to everyone  
who pleases God."

<sup>15</sup> After the angels had left and gone back to heaven, the shepherds said to each other, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see what the Lord has told us about." <sup>16</sup> They hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and they saw the baby lying on a bed of hay.

<sup>17</sup> When the shepherds saw Jesus, they told his parents what the angel had said about him. <sup>18</sup> Everyone listened and was surprised. <sup>19</sup> But Mary kept thinking about all this and wondering what it meant.

<sup>20</sup> As the shepherds returned to their sheep, they were praising God and saying wonderful things about him. Everything they had seen and heard was just as the angel had said.
