Reflections from the Heart

THANK YOU MOM!

Here's an odd question for you. How many Moms do you have? What kind of question is that? How many Moms can one person have? Answer: It depends. There is the birth Mom and the Mom who raised you. Sometimes they are the same person, and sometimes they are not. Throw a spiritual Mom into the mix. Again, she may be the same as the other two...but she may not. Then there is the step Mom. The step Mom and birth Mom aren't likely to be the same person, but the step Mom could also be the Mom who raised you, and the spiritual Mom. Are you still with me?

I am blessed because my birth Mom, the Mom who raised me, and my spiritual Mom are one and the same. When I grew up and moved out from the shelter of my Mom's care, other Moms "adopted" me. When I moved to Kansas I picked up my "Kansas Mom." With my Mom living in Rhode Island, I needed a Mom who was

geographically closer. My “Kansas Mom” talked me through many of my early parenting scares.

My Mother-in-law has also been a special treasure. When Keith and I married and I became more and more involved in church programs, his Mom gently reminded me that “God created the family before He created the church,” so my first responsibility needed to be to my family. That is spiritual advice I have cherished and followed over the years.

I have also had the privilege of being called “Mom” by children I have not given birth to. These are children whose hearts are connected to mine because God brought us together.

So I’ll ask again. How many Moms do you have? And a new question...how many people are you a Mom for? (Guys...get ready...you’ll be addressing similar questions next month!)

Just as babies are physically born and need care, so those who are spiritually born need care. Those of us who have accepted Christ as Savior and Lord become brothers and sisters in Christ. And that is a wonderful thing! But we need to be aware of where people are spiritually. If someone is a spiritual infant, they need spiritual parents to guide them. They need older brothers and sisters to show them the way.
